

EAGLE SCOUT – SILVER PALM HONOR ROLL

Boy Scouting offers youth who achieve the rank of Eagle Scout the unique opportunity to continue their Scouting program through active leadership and advancement. The Bronze, Gold and Silver Palm recognizes those special Eagle Scouts who continue to provide leadership to Scouting in three month increments and earn five additional merit badges.

In order to earn the Silver Palm, a Scout must complete a total of nine months of active leadership and fifteen merit badges beyond the required twenty-one for Eagle Scout.

For those select Eagle Scouts who achieve the Silver Palm, the Denver Area Council awards them recognition as members of the Silver Palm Honor Roll. The program includes:

1. A silver ribbon with the Eagle Scout's name and unit number to be permanently attached to the Unit flag.
2. A special breakfast to recognize Silver Palm recipients
3. Placement of the Eagle Scout's name along with the year of achievement on a plaque that is displayed in the front lobby of the Council Service Center.

The Silver Palm Honor Roll is a unique and special way to encourage Eagle Scouts to continue their contribution and success in the Scouting program. Here's why:

1. Units need experienced Scouts to successfully conduct their program and Eagle Scouts are the best resource a unit can have.
2. The program encourages Eagle Scouts to seek a meaningful leadership Roll in their unit, e.g. Junior Assistant Scoutmaster, in order to best influence the program and other Scouts' progress.
3. Unit leaders and Scouts benefit from active involvement of these leaders – it's a win-win for all.
